Boston (December 20, 2022)—The BSA is pleased to announce the winners of its 11th annual Gingerbread Design Competition & Exhibition. This year's competition theme "**Climate Ginger-Ready Boston**," a play on the City's Climate Ready Boston initiative, invited participants to explore climate solutions through an edible medium. The BSA encouraged all forms of creative, sustainable, climate-resilient gingerbread designs that speak to the unique challenges that Boston faces.

The Gingerbread Design competition is a fun and tasty way to highlight great works of edible architecture while also raising funds for the BSA. We are pleased to announce that we raised a total of \$5,860 during this year's exhibition. These funds will help support the ongoing work of the BSA.
