- 1. Introduce yourself: What's your name and what would you like us to know about you?
- 2. Tell us your idea: What input or ideas for a future-decker or other housing types would you like to share? Where should they be (<u>list of sites here</u>)
- 3. Other: Is there anything else you would like to share?
- 1. I am an architect with a small firm that has been working in housing of all types in all sectors, including design-support for the City of Boston DND for the last 5 years.
- 2. With the City's policy for zero-emissions buildings, I believe the acceptable methods for achieving this goal should also include mitigation *outside* the building site. For example, changing out the neighbor's old oil-burning furnace with a high-efficiency gas unit will save much more in carbon emissions faster and for far less money than building to Passivehaus or any other zero-energy standard. The environment doesn't care which site the savings is taken; it does care that the carbon savings is substantial and immediate. This is also a less costly option for affordable housing, which would enable more projects to be built.
